Welcome to the latest edition of the Platin Local Community Newsletter.

While Covid has not gone away we are pleased to see a return to some more normal activities in the factory including a resumption of site visits by some local schools.

Our team of employees and contractors completed a successful overhaul of the entire factory last month with 15,000 hours worked in 28 days and with no lost time accidents, it was a great performance.

After a lengthy licence review process we received a new environmental licence from the EPA in October 2021. The revised licence allows us to accelerate our fossil fuel replacement plans and improves the long-term sustainability of the factory. Our ambition in Platin is to achieve over 80% fossil fuel replacement by 2030 which is the target set in the Government's Climate Action Plan for the cement industry.

We will soon be establishing a local community forum to engage directly with our neighbours on our operations and ongoing environmental performance. I will provide further updates in future Newsletters.

A team in Platin has been working since 2020 on achieving the Energy Management System ISO 50001 which is considered the global benchmark standard for Energy Management. This international standard is compatible with other management system standards in Platin like ISO 9001 Quality Management Standard and ISO 14001 Environmental Management Systems Standard.

ISO 50001 recognises the ongoing improvements in energy performance, energy efficiency, energy use and consumption in Platin. In addition, it sets out an overall energy policy, prioritises monitoring and measuring of energy performance and longer-term energy planning. The team expects certification to ISO 50001 during the summer.
